

HONOR COUNCIL ACTS ON FLITTER CASE

Since the students of this college endo sed the Pass-Fail Petition, a few explanatory notes might help to give all a better understanding of what such a system means.

One question brought to my attention was, "Would the professor know which of his students were carrying his course on a pass-fail basis?" Under the proposed system, this information would be confider. tial; only the student and the registrar would be allowed such information. This is to safeguard against possible prejudice on the part of the instructor.

Some have questioned the probability of whether or not P(pass) grades would be transferable to ot her colleges. Most colleges of any quality will readily accept a P grade as a C when transferred. However, some of the smaller schools will not give credit for such grades. This is of little concern to most of us since only a small percentage of students actually trans the fixer

Pass - Fail?





Students across the country are complaining of a lack of voice in campus affairs. I have never really agreed that students should decide matters of curriculum for themselves, but I have always felt that the appropriate faculty committees could enact more enlightened requirements if they would at least listen to what the students have to say.

Unfortunately, most of the stu-

dents making demands these days are looking for "action" not "inter-action". They call attention to their movement by the use of four-letter words, presumably hoping that the shock value of those words will attract the attention of those to whom they appeal. Well, radical students, I hate to disillusion you, but the shock value of the four-letter word has pretty well worn off in the five years since Berkeley. Now, except for a limited "camp" value, the four-letter word is just another symbol of communication that is generally considered in bad taste in fields other than art.

There is little to gripe about anyway. Change is on the way here at Madison. Students have a say in what's going on. Dr. Eugene R. Moulton of the Department of Speech and Drama invited three students that represented a cross-section of the department to participate in departmental faculty meetings. Except in matters involving salary, these students are expected to take part in all decisions and contribute their opinions and complaints. What more can be asked?



Reform In The History Department

A funny thing happened to me on the way to supper londay night. fellow redical and I wandered into Marrison 205 where Dr. Dingledine was conducting a meeting between listory majors and some faculty members from the History department. The purpose of the meeting was to organize a History club (I wonder if it will take TIN three months to get recognized on campus). However, the really important news o came during a question-answer period with Dr. Dingledine. It seems that the History Department is in the process of tryin; to alter the requirements for a degree in its major. Is of 1970, there will be no B.S. degree in History. To acquire the B.A., a student will have to complete the second year of a foreign language and take three hours of Philosophy. The other major change being proposed concerns the total number of hours required in the major. At the present time, 43 hours are required, with 30 of these from History courses, 18 in' the Social Sciences and Humanities. The proposed change would reduce this requirement to 32 hours all in History courses. Dr. Dingledine

said teses changes were being made for two reasons: "to give greater flexibility to students," and "to offer the student who is going into teaching the opportunity to get enough courses in another field to be certified in that field." These changes were approved by the Curriculum and Instruction Committee and went before the faculty on Tuesday Dec. 9. Although there is much sentiment against the language requirement, these changes are basically in the students' favor and deserve to be passed by the faculty.

Dr. Dingledine also revealed certain course additions planned for next year. Full-year courses are planned in Tast Asian and Russian History. There will also be semester courses in Modern Middle East and Modern China History. These additions will improve the already fine History Department. And the above mentioned reforms will serve as a stimulus and a challenge for other Departments




