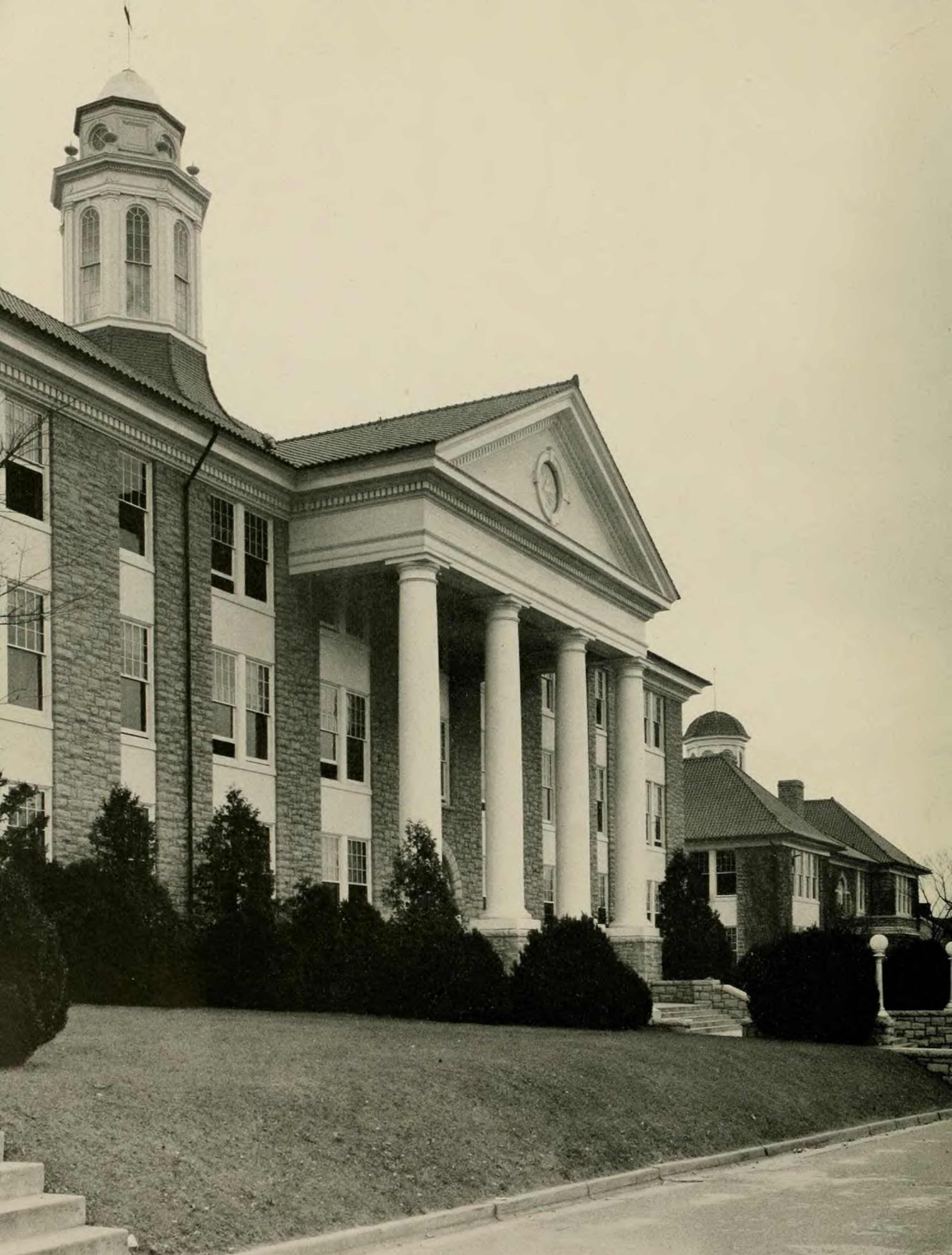
*He was not too wise to talk with us,

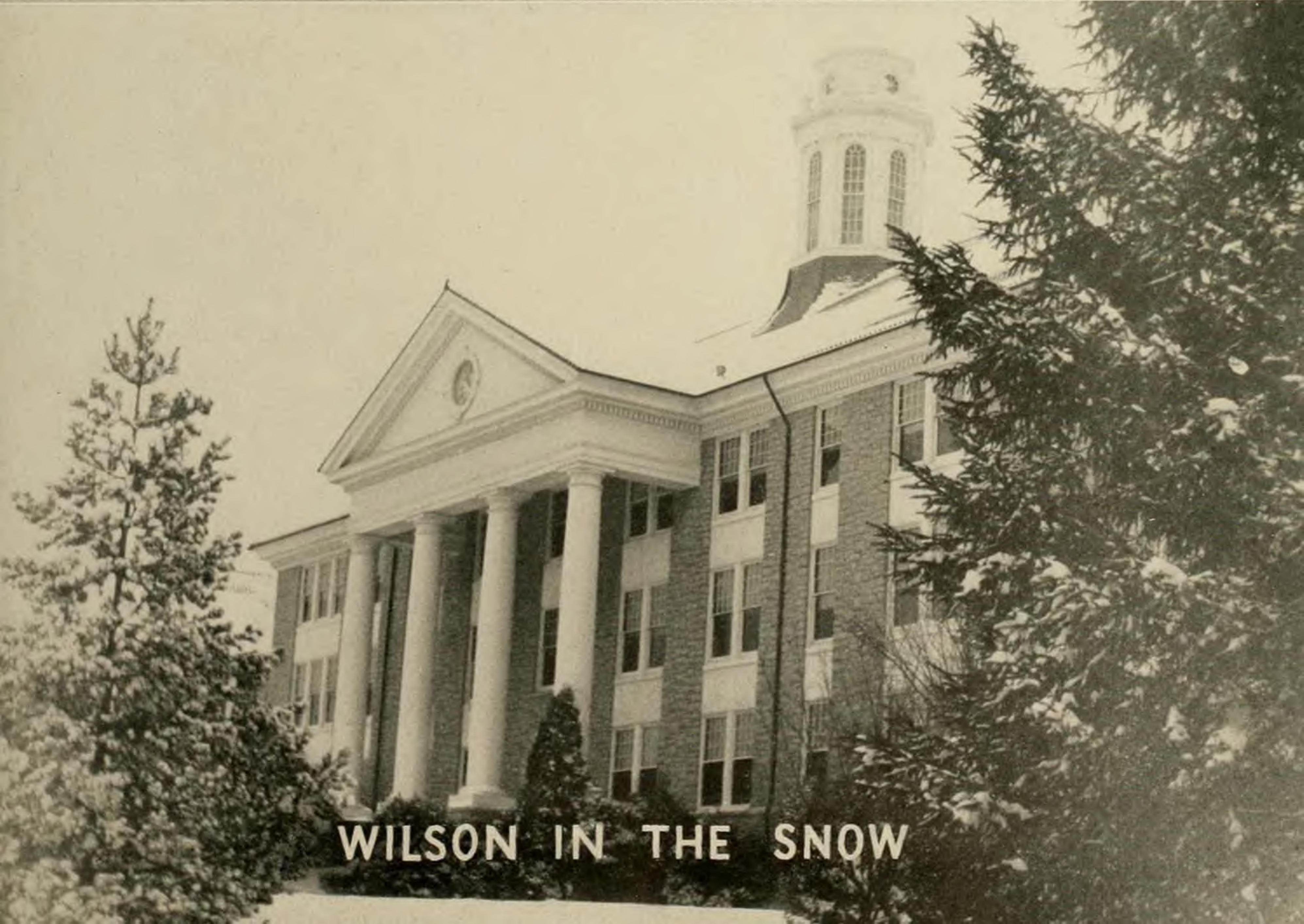

"School life" is actually the essence of our college inheritance from a past Madison. It represents the intangible spirit, made up of tangible people, places, and things, of our college life.

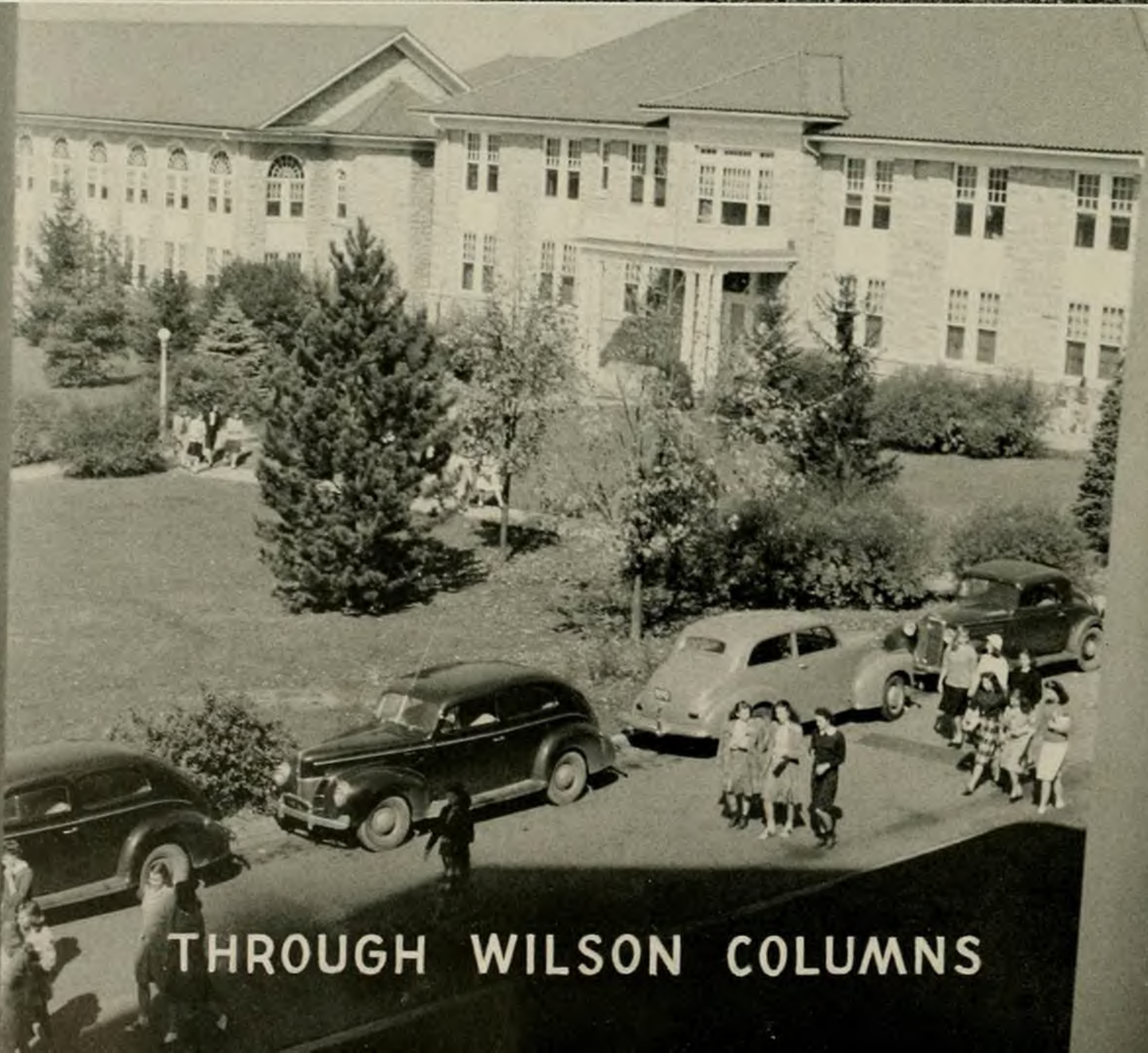
## FEATURES

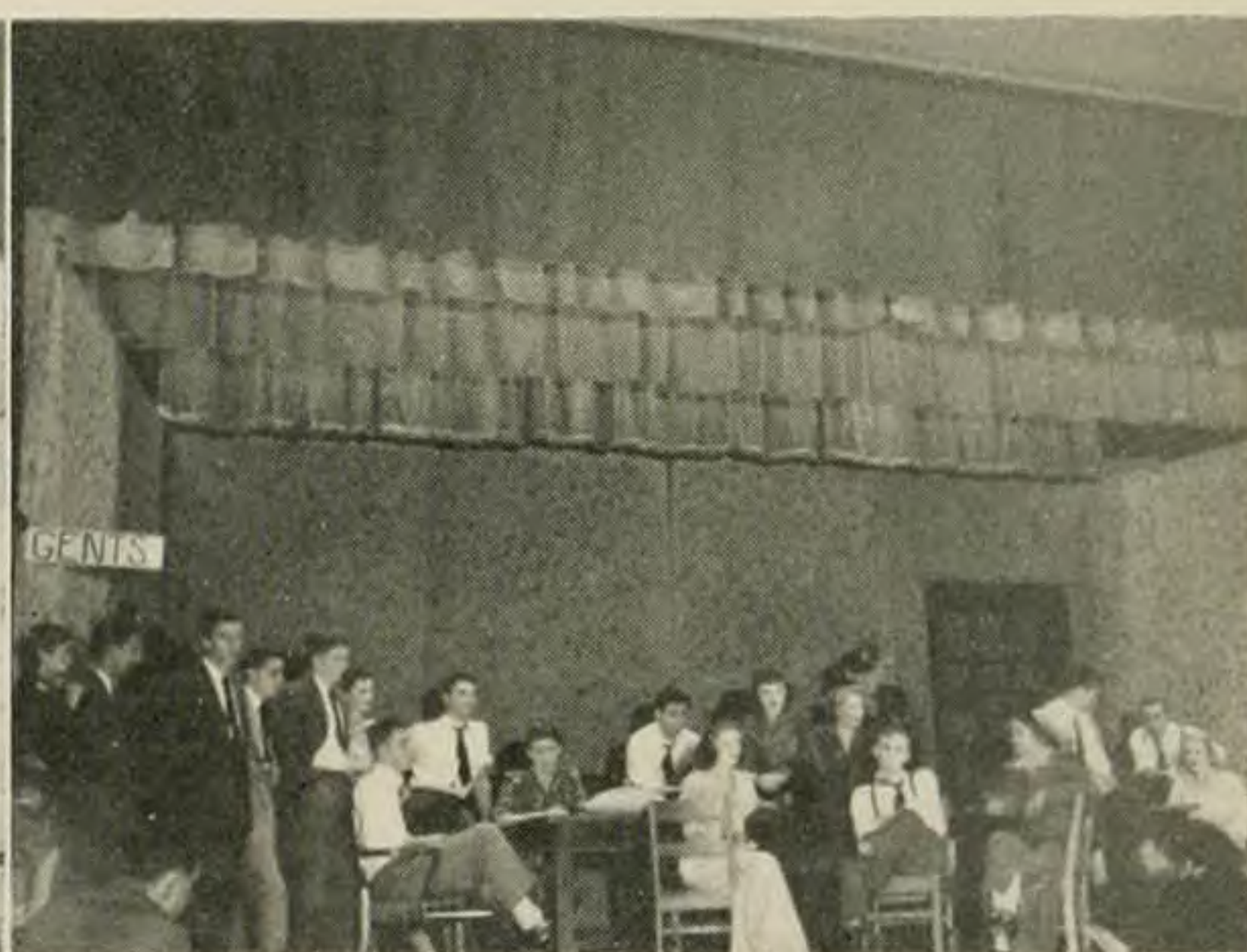

As a social organization, the club had several parties this year, the initiation party in October being the most important.

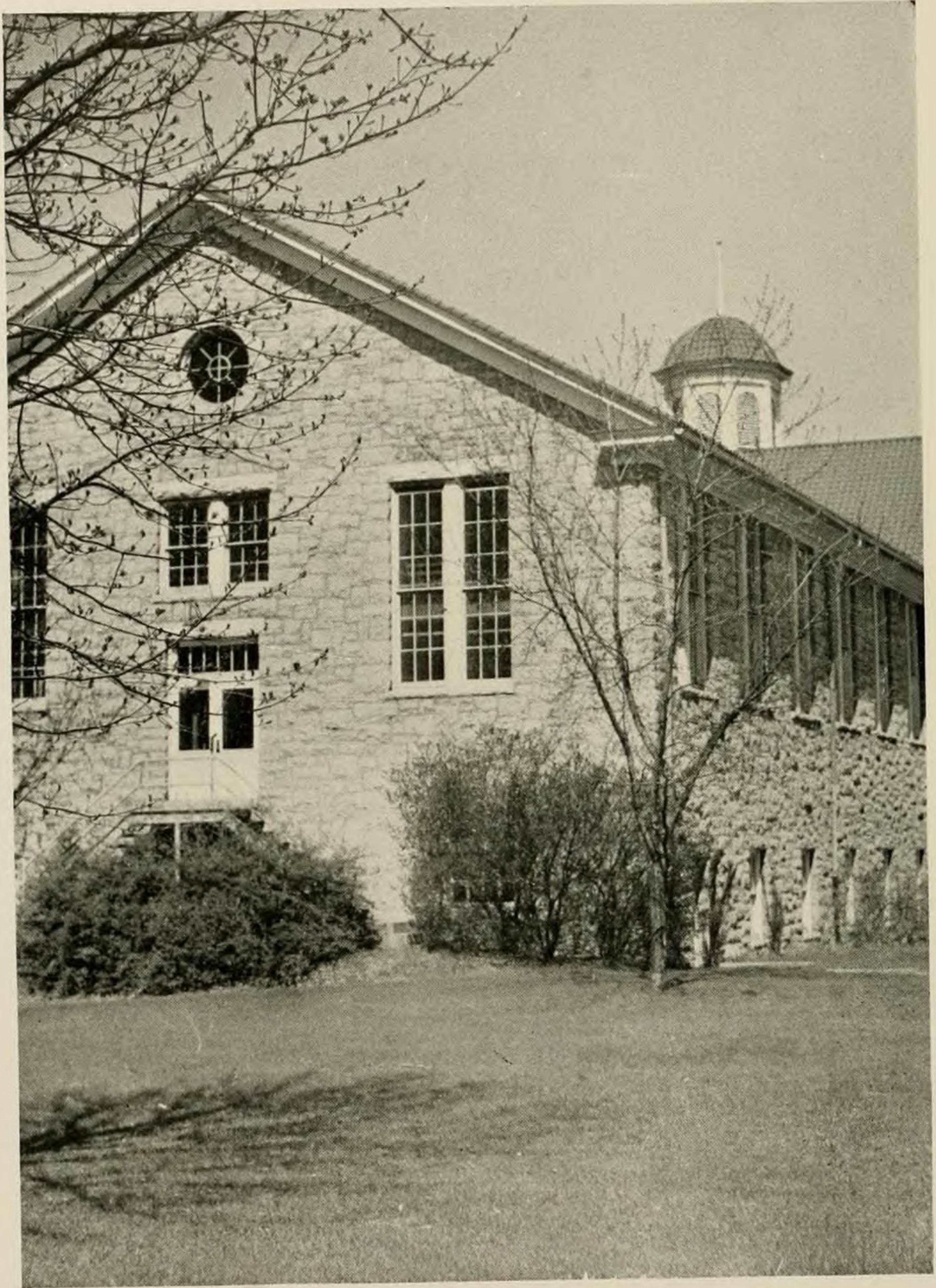

# Archery Club

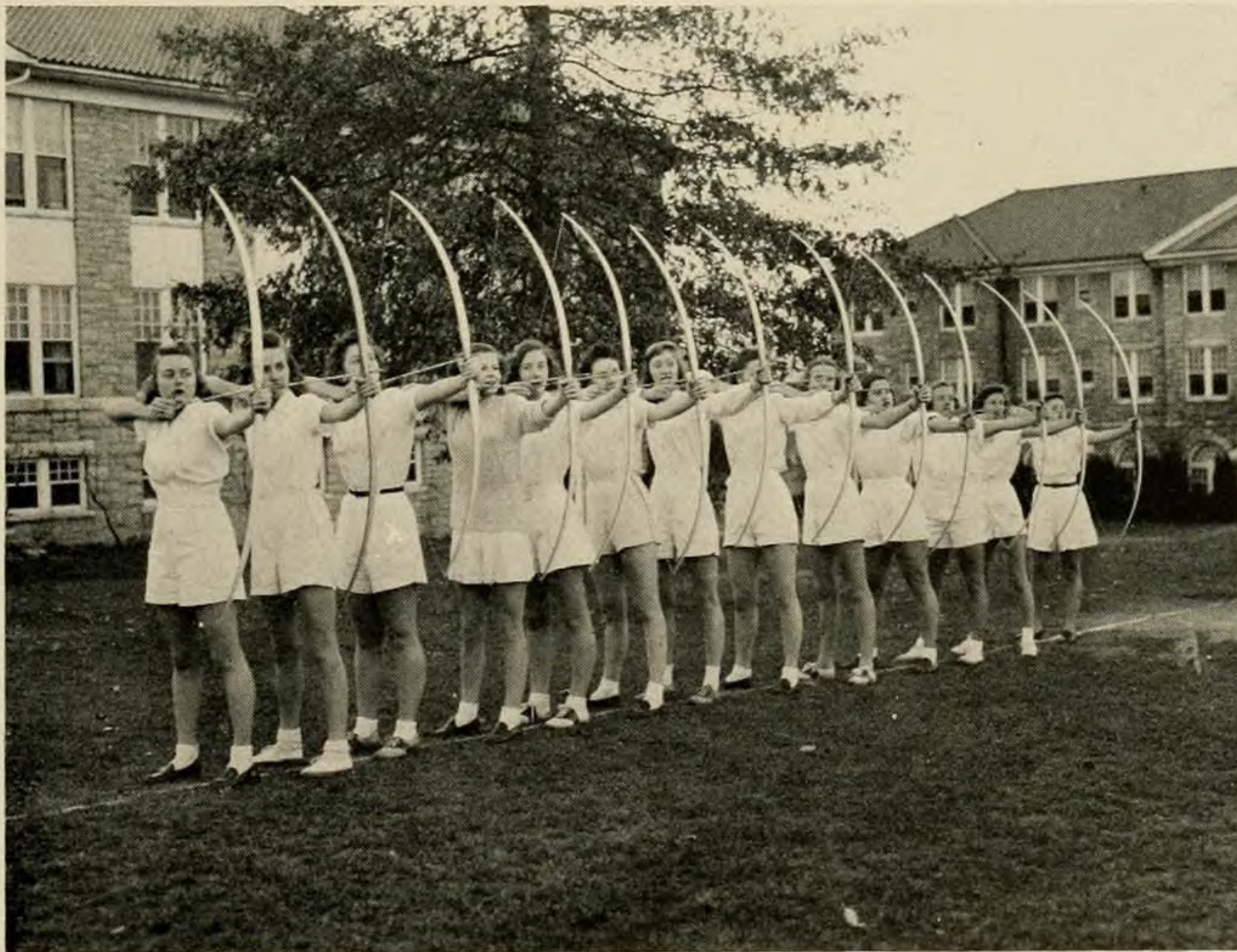

They say club members keep their slim figures by chasing their own arrows. That's much more pleasant than skimping on calories, don't you think?



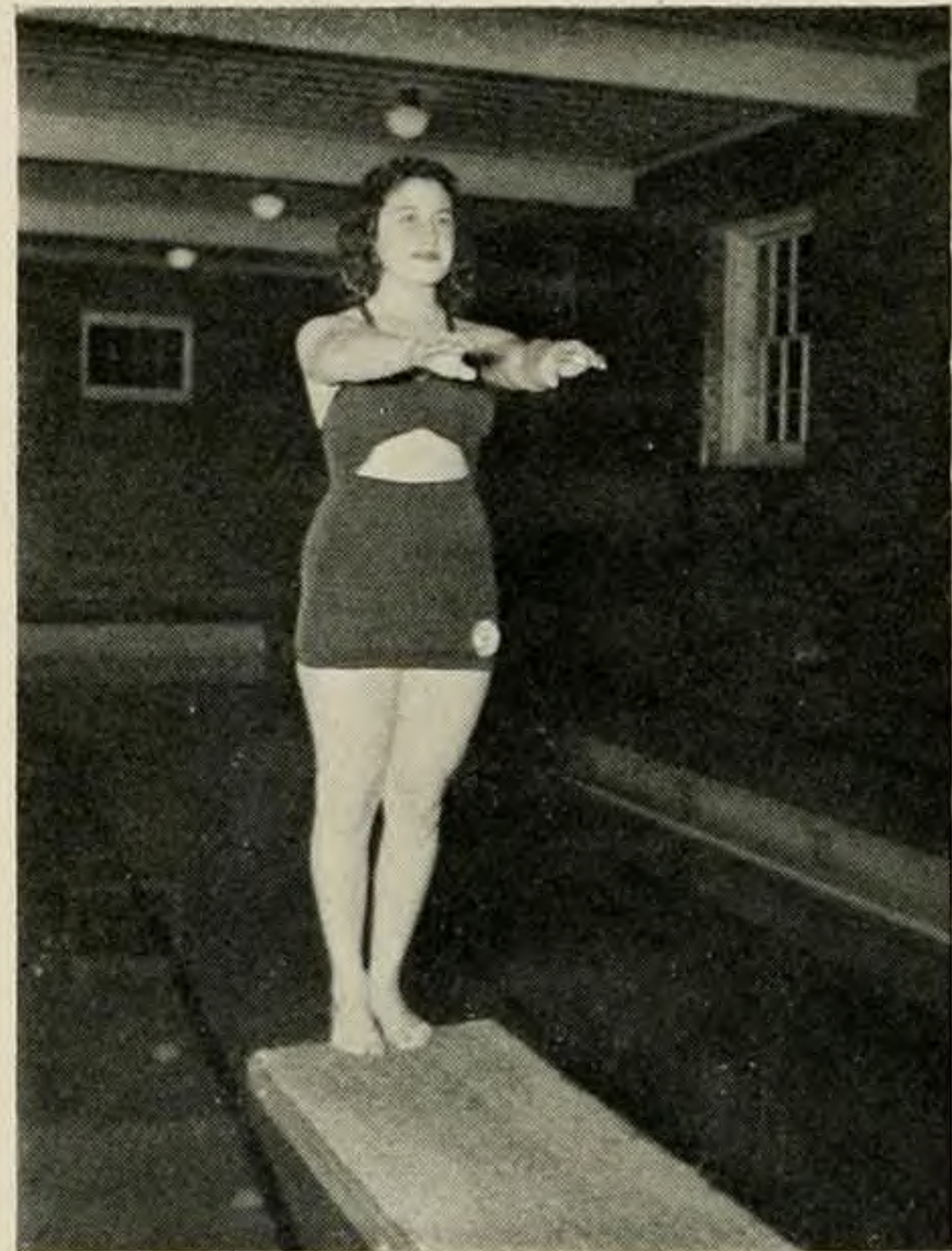

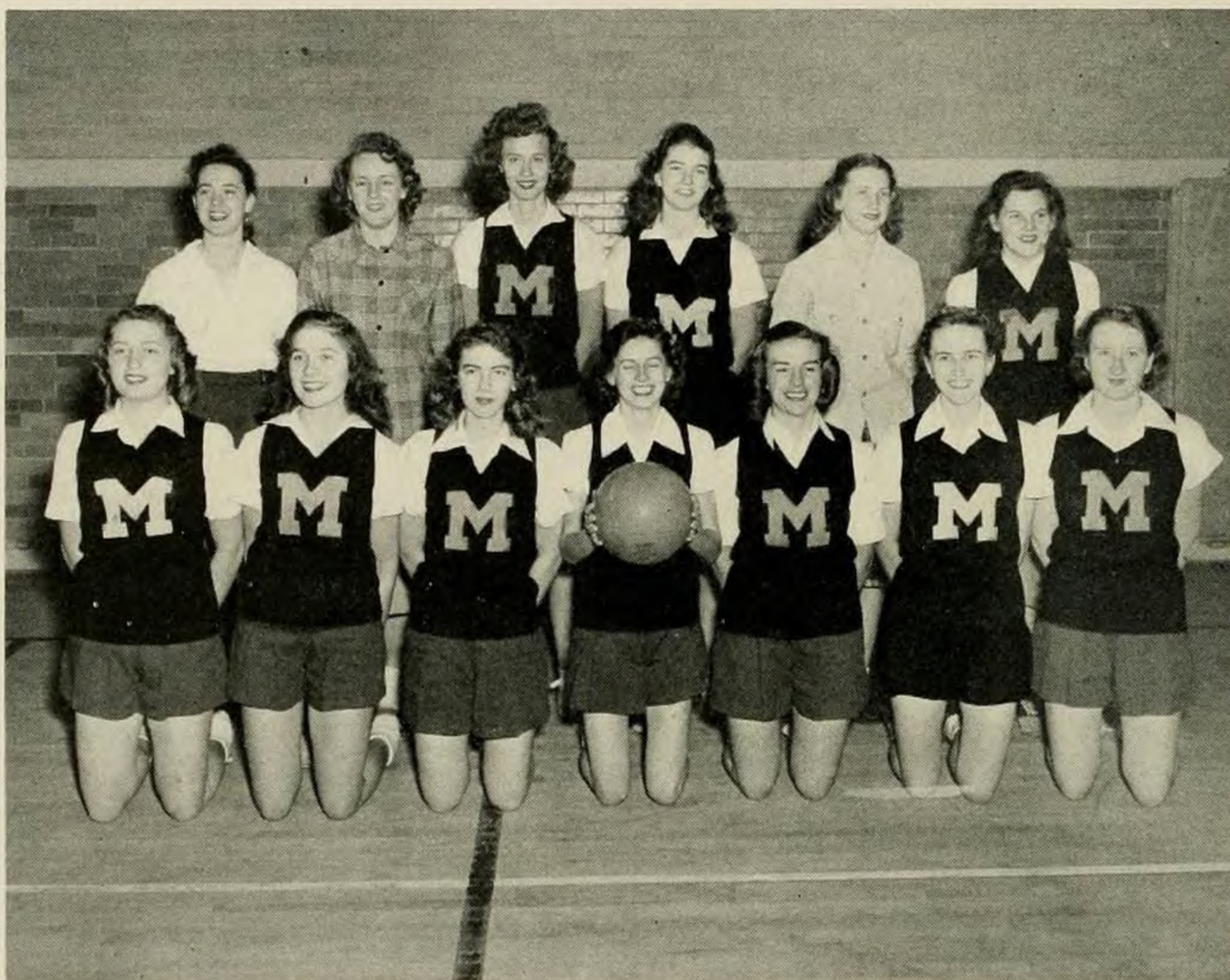
Old Porpoise members were grateful for the two days of fall and spring goat-ing when new members made beds, swept floors, and performed other troublesome domestic duties for them.
